

Dear Parents/Carers

Next half term we will be starting the 'Changing me' unit of work in PSHE. Some of the lessons in this unit are linked in an age appropriate way to our Sex and Relationship Education. Below are the lessons that will be taught. Please contact me if you require any further information about these sessions.

Year Two

1. Life Cycles in Nature	I can recognise cycles of life in nature. I understand there are some changes that are outside my control and can recognise how I feel about this.
2. Growing from Young to Old	I can tell you about the natural process of growing from young to old and understand that this is not in my control. I can identify people I respect who are older than me.
3. The Changing Me	I can recognise how my body has changed since I was a baby and where I am on the continuum from young to old. I feel proud about becoming more independent.
4. Boys' and Girls' Bodies	I can recognise the physical differences between boys and girls, use the correct names for parts of the body (penis, testicles, vagina) and appreciate that some parts of my body are private. I can tell you what I like/don't like about being a boy/girl.
5. Assertiveness	I understand there are different types of touch and can tell you which ones I like and don't like. I am confident to say what I like and don't like and can ask for help.
6. Looking Ahead	I can identify what I am looking forward to when I am in Year 3. I can start to think about changes I will make when I am in Year 3 and know how to go about this.

During Year Two Science lessons children will learn to notice that animals, including humans, have offspring which grow into adults. They will be introduced to the processes of reproduction and growth in animals. However, they will not be taught to understand how reproduction occurs as the focus at this age is on understanding growth. Science is a compulsory subject and there is no right for parents to withdraw their children from the Science curriculum.

Any parent wishing to exercise their right to withdraw their child from all or part of the PSHE teaching of Sex and Relationship Education must indicate this wish on the reply slip below by ticking the lessons they would like their child to be withdrawn from.
